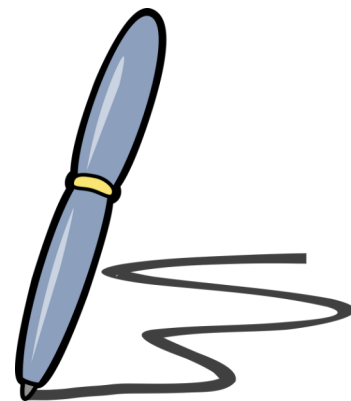


Parishes of Killaney and Carryduff Summer 2026

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Sarah writes

How are you? When we ask someone how they are there are usually one or two responses, "I'm fine", "I'm busy" or "I'm tired". I've noticed recently that the common reply to that question has been "I'm tired". As a society, we all seem tired in life and somewhat lethargic, and it's not surprising, considering what we've had to deal with over the past few years. It's not something that a strong coffee or multivitamin can fix; we're all ready for a break, we all need to take time to rest.



I've recently been reading around Romans 12V1 and the idea that we are to be living sacrifices until God takes us home to be with Jesus. As author Christopher Ash notes, we are to offer ourselves as those who have life to offer rather than a tired wreck. We witness in the gospels Jesus, the Son of God, taking time to rest, and spending time with God. Usually, He retreated to a mountaintop to regain strength and energy for the task ahead, so rest is biblical. When you committed to following Jesus and surrendered your life to him, you did not offer him the sacrifice and services of complete health, or a never exhausted creature, rather you offered him the fragile, mortal frail life that he gave you. God knows exactly who you are, what's going on and how tired you are. The truth is, as humans we need sleep, we need Sabbaths, we need friends, we need food. As someone once said, "God has put the medicines on the table and we need to take them".

My prayer this summer is that we would all have time to refresh our bodies, our minds and souls, and be ready to commit afresh to being living sacrifices. As The Message paraphrase translates Romans 12V11, "Don't burn out; keep yourselves fuelled and aflame".

So how do we keep ourselves fuelled and aflame? Rest is not permission to take a break from time spent with God, but rather it is a rest away from labours. In order to keep the fire aflame we must keep adding coal and wood to burners, so to speak. The 'coal and wood' that we need consist of spending time with God in prayer, reading his word, gathering for worship and having fellowship with others.

So, this summer, let us rest our minds, bodies and souls in the knowledge that God tightly holds each one of us, whatever our circumstances, in the palm of his hands.

LOGOS HOPE UK TOUR 2026

The visit of Logos Hope – with her crew and her stories – is to be used as a catalyst for all that God is already doing through His people in the UK. The vision for Logos Hope's UK tour, 'Waves of Hope' is to create a sense of encouragement and renewal of the UK Church's response to God's call to make Him known here and around the world. Together, we're raising a tide of faith and releasing waves of hope across our nation and beyond. Since Operation Mobilisation launched Logos Hope in 2009, nearly 11 million people have visited the ship. We warmly invite you to experience her



history, stories and mission too. You'll be able to meet the crew, participate in onboard events, enjoy the cafe, wander the bookfair and much more. The ship will be in the port of Belfast from 1st - 22nd October. We plan to organise groups to visit the ship.

New Horizon

Every year the New Horizon Christian festival is held at the University of Ulster, Coleraine. This year it will run from 1st-7th August and the theme is 'Christ Our Life'. There are two sessions each day; the morning one will be Bible teaching on the supremacy and sufficiency of Christ as expounded in St Paul's letter to the Colossians. The evening session will be a celebration of worship and teaching, and being encouraged by stories of what God is doing in His world. This will be led by various speakers. New Horizon is a great opportunity to take time out from the busyness of life and 'take in' from listening to the best of expository Bible preaching and meeting up with 'old' friends and making new ones.

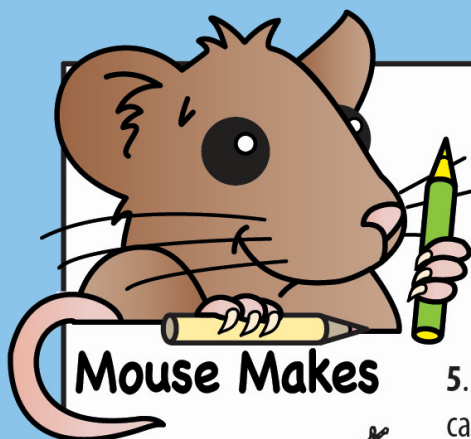

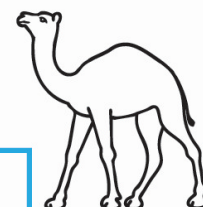

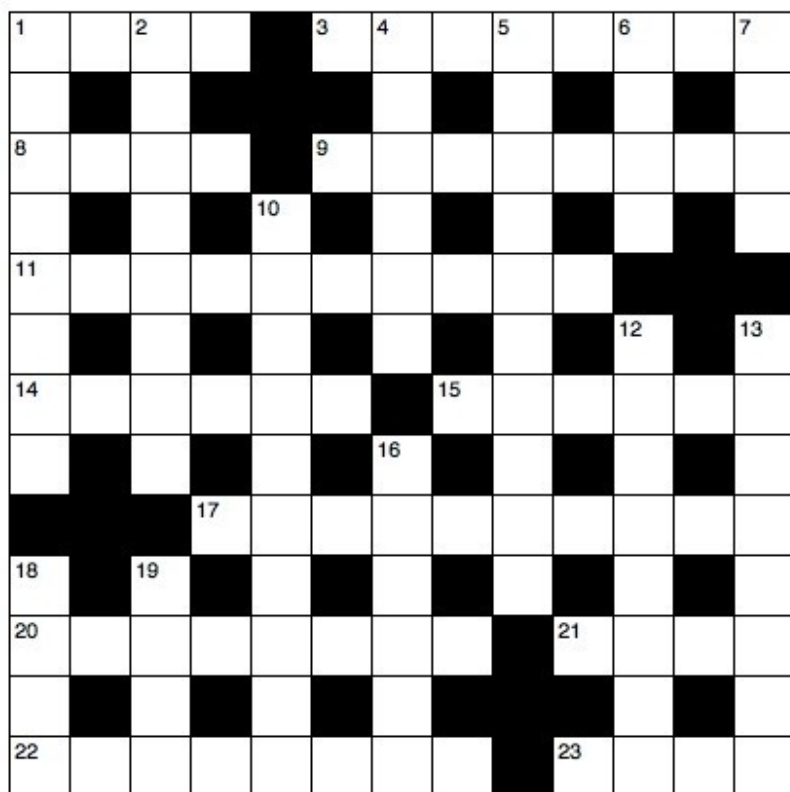
